She is a past-President of the Modern Language Association of America (2010). Her most recent book is *Manifesto for the Humanities: Transforming Doctoral Education in Good Enough Times* (2015). It is now available open access through the Digital Culture Series of the University of Michigan Press.

She is author of A Poetics of Women's Autobiography (1987) and Subjectivity, Identity, and the Body (1993). With Julia Watson, she co-authored Reading Autobiography: A Guide for Interpreting Life Narratives (2001; expanded edition, 2010); and co-edited five volumes, including De/Colonizing the Subject: The Politics of Gender in Women's Autobiography and Getting a Life: Everyday Uses of Autobiography. With Kay Schaffer, she authored Human Rights and Narrated Lives (2004).
